- 1. Go to http://co.chelan.wa.us/auditor/pages/genealogy
- 2. In the upper right, click/hover on Online Services
- 3. Choose Recording: Document Search
- 4. Choose Name Search
- 5. Enter last and first names
- 6. Under Document Type, choose Marriage Application
- 7. Search
- 8. Select the name you're searching from the drop-down list and click **Done**
- 9. Click on the person's name to see the image
